New Short Learning Programme : "Clinical Skills for Hospital Pharmacists"



NMMU's short learning programme "Clinical Skills for Hospital Pharmacists" – The course presenters Jane McCartney, Dr Shirley-Anne Boschmans, Dr Sue Burton from NMMU and participants from Life Healthcare, in Johannesburg.

Wednesday 26th June 2013 saw the launch of NMMU's newly developed Short Learning Programme "Clinical Skills for Hospital Pharmacists", at Life Healthcare's Head Office in Johannesburg. The SLP has been developed by Pharmacy staff members, Mrs Jane McCartney, Dr Shirley-Anne Boschmans, Dr Sue Burton and Miss Lia Kritiotis in response to a request from Life Healthcare's management.

The SLP consists of four modules which will be presented over a year, with the aim of equipping Life Healthcare hospital pharmacists with the necessary clinical skills to introduce clinical pharmacy services in this private hospital group.

Life Healthcare have selected and registered 22 pharmacists, representing Life Healthcare hospitals around South Africa and Botswana.

Module One was presented over 3 days in June 2013 and focused on Medicine Management. The participants will now start to introduce pharmacist-led medication reviews in selected wards.

The SLP was officially launched at a dinner function in Johannesburg on Thursday 27th of June, at which Mr Michael Flemming (CEO, Life Healthcare), stressed the importance of the pharmacists in ensuring quality of patient care through their role in managing medicine-related issues in the hospital setting, not only in the dispensary but also in the clinical environment.

Module Two will be presented in October 2013 by Jane McCartney, Dr Sue Burton and Lia Kritiotis.

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Welcome to Dr Lynsey Knoetzen



As part of the understanding which exists between the American International Health Alliance (AIHA) and Nelson Mandela Metropolitan University (NMMU), Dr Lynsey Knoetzen has been appointed as lecturer in the Pharmacy Department. This appointment has been made possible through AIHA's mentorship program, where various professionals in their capacity as mentors with the organisation, are placed at institutions showing need for their skills.

Dr Knoetzen holds both a BPharm degree, which she obtained at the University of Port Elizabeth (now NMMU), as well as an MBChB, obtained at the University of the Witwatersrand.

Her appointment is of such a nature that she is involved in both the BPharm Clinical Program, and the new Pharmacy Technical Assistant (PTA) and Pharmacy Technician (PT) programs. She is responsible for module development with regard to the module on Practical Pharmaceutics, which she currently lectures, for the PTA students; but is also assisting with the BPharm final year hospital program.

NMMU's Pharmacy Department hosts the inaugural meeting of the Eastern Cape branch of SASoCP



The Eastern Cape branch of the South African Society of Clinical Pharmacy (SASoCP) was recently launched at an evening function, sponsored by Aspen Pharmacare and held at the Presidential Suite at St George's Park. The National Chairperson, Prof Andries Gous was the invited guest speaker at the launch, at which the Eastern Cape branch committee was officially voted in. Mrs Leanne Stone was announced as the Eastern Cape branch chairperson, with Miss Cahlia Howard as the vice-chairperson and Mrs Lindsay Dillon as the branch secretary.

The inaugural meeting of the new branch was hosted the next day, Saturday 17th August, by NMMU's Department of Pharmacy. The meeting, in the form of a workshop on "Antimicrobial Stewardship", was well attended by close to 40 pharmacists and pharmacy students. During the tea and lunch breaks, delegates were able to visit the informative exhibition stands from three pharmaceutical companies, Pfizer, Aspen Pharmacare and MSD.

Clinical pharmacy is a specialised area of pharmacy involved with the rational and appropriate use of medicines and pharmaceutical care, in the interest of the patient and the community. The need for specialisation in the pharmacy profession is being driven by the statutory body, the South African Pharmacy Council (SAPC), who announced their intent to open a register of specialities for pharmacists. The scope of practice of the specialist clinical pharmacist has now been published, and interest amongst pharmacists is growing rapidly.

MediKredit - "train the trainer"



On 14 June 2013, 3 MediKredit representatives, namely Wayne, Trevor du Plessis and Dina-Mare came to Port Elizabeth to present a "train the trainer" workshop for the NMMU Department of Pharmacy staff. The objective of the workshop was to introduce the staff to the history of MediKredit, and to familiarise the NMMU staff with the claiming process using MediKredit technology. Medi-Kredit with the endorsement of Profmed have enabled the staff and students at NMMU to do live, on-line claiming using the Profmed Medical Aid rules. A database of "dummy" patients has been loaded onto the MediKredit system allowing immediate claiming with real-time responses. This will allow students to interpret rejection codes and problem solve possible solutions in a safe environment giving them more confidence when in the workplace. We are very grateful to MediKredit for donating their time and effort to NMMU.

NMMU Pharmacy Department first Career Fair

The Pharmacy Department hosted an open day on the 2nd August 2013. The NMMU pharmacy staff and stakeholders from different pharmacy sectors were invited to introduce the students to the various career options available in the profession of Pharmacy. The Career Fair was held in the South Campus Auditorium and on the day, the auditorium was a picture of professionalism and excellence. The stakeholders presented employment opportunities for pharmacists within their companies and invited applications for employment to our current final year students.

Presentations were made by the Mopani Pharmacy chain from Mpumalanga, Discovery Health, Dischem, Medi-rite, Aspen Pharmacare, the Independent Community Pharmacy Association, PPS and the South African Pharmacy Council. In



addition Dischem, PPS and Medi-rite manned stalls in the foyer where students could interact with the companies. A presentation on postgraduate studies and the attractions of academia as a career was made by Prof Ilse Truter. This was followed by a presentation by Keith Daniell a postgraduate student in the Pharmacy Department. Keith recently spent six months in Sweden at the Karolinska Institute. Keith entertained the students with stories about his stay in Sweden while also making them aware of the wonderful opportunities available to postgraduate students.

The Career Fair, as can be seen by the photograph, was attended by all BPharm students from 1st year to 4th year as well as by the PTA students. This provided the various speakers with a packed auditorium.

Sports Injuries Workshop



Research News



Prof. Ilse Truter from the Drug Utilization Research Unit of the Department of Pharmacy at NMMU attended the European Congress of Epidemiology in Aarhus, Denmark from 11 to 14 August 2013. The congress was attended by approximately 700 people. She presented an oral paper on the Transnet-Phelophepa Health Care Train as a source of primary health care data in rural South Africa, as well as a poster on the treatment of Alzheimer's disease.

Pharmacy Staff present at International Education Symposium

In July this year, three of our staff members - Shirley-Anne Boschmans, Teri-Lynne Fogarty and Sue Burton attended the 7th Monash Pharmacy Education Symposium in Prato, Italy. The symposium is hosted biannually by the Faculty of Pharmacy and Pharmaceutical Sciences of Monash University, at the University's Centre in Prato. The Centre is an eighteenth century mansion in the heart of Tuscany and certainly made for a wonderful symposium venue. The theme of this year's symposium was "Teaching for Learning" and there was an excellent programme of international speakers, who were engaging, challenging and inspirational. At the Symposium Teri -Lynne presented a poster entitled: "An improved pharmacy midlevel qualification in South Africa: possibility of co-teaching pharmacists and pharmacy technicians", which was related to her work on the Higher Certificate in Pharmacy support programme.

Shirley-Anne and Sue both presented work arising from their doctoral studies. Shirley-Anne's poster was entitled: "Mother tongue or English language skills as predictors of pharmacy student achievement in a pharmacology module."

Sue's oral presentation: "Pharmacy educators: firelighters, pastors, mirrors or chefs?" was awarded the prize for the best podium presentation.
